- Long life fruit juice
- Tinned or packet puddings
- Tinned fish
- Tinned meat
- Packets of biscuits
- Rice, pasta or noodles
- Tea bags
- Coffee
- Jam
- Soup
- Cereal
- Tinned Tomatoes
- Rice pudding
- Tinned custard and of course, at Christmas chocolate is appreciated.

Unwrapped small gifts suitable as stocking fillers are also very welcome as are financial donations if you wish to support us in this way
